## **Brotherly Love!**



This is February, the month of love. Each of you husbands should give your wife a hug, tell them thanks for allowing you to do what you like to do (attend lodge and spend time away from her while doing something that improves you and the world) and show her love. This is natural and will also keep you out of trouble. There is another form of love that is not so easy to show – *brotherly love*.

Why is love between men (or brothers) so... *uncomfortable*?

As men (Men with a capital "M" of course!), we are tough, macho and independent. So, I find it strange that none of the three great Masonic encyclopedias (Coil's, Mackey's and Macoy's) includes anything on this subject in their works. I guess it must not be important for us to learn about.



#### Wrong!

Brotherly love is one of the three (3) great principles taught a newly-made Mason and is found along with relief and truth in this group. The "five points of fellowship" really expresses this, but we get so wrapped up in the deeper meanings associated with this symbol that we neglect to see what is clearly seen by others when they look at it one brother expressing support and love to the other.

Luckily, George Oliver does mention brotherly love in his "A Dictionary of Symbolic Masonry" and compares it with God's love in extent, broadness and good will. When you read between the lines in his definition, he says when a compass is used to circumscribe our passions and a square used to test them, love fills in the rest of the circle.



Manly Hall may have it right when he wrote that:

"He [man] is able to classify the entire procedure of life and postulate laws by which the universe if governed, but the riddle of love has proved more elusive than the riddle of life itself."

Love is hard for some men to show and communicate. Yet it is at the root of all of us knowing Deity and being able to express this Being's principles. Love makes the lodge run well and helps us through this journey called life. It gives us the urge to do good works, help those around us, improve the world we live in and to give a hand to those who are want to ascend upward along with us.
