



## Denver Consistory 9Health Fair - Saturday, April 22 7:00 AM to NOON

Mark your calendars and plan to help us as a volunteer for our 23<sup>rd</sup> 9Health Fair at the Consistory (this will be 9HealthFair's 38<sup>th</sup> annual fair—so we have been with them for a significant majority of time). **There is a 20% discount on test fees for VOLUNTEERS and 1st-timers.** You can even arrange to have your bloodwork done at OUR fair if you are a volunteer.

This year, there will be a new optional blood screening available. You can get your blood tested for testosterone levels (\$35 for males; \$45 for females - higher cost for females is due to the complexity and processing of that particular sample). Women have a smaller amount of testosterone than men, but it plays an important role in both men and women. It affects the brain, bone, and muscle mass, fat distribution, energy levels, and the vascular system.

There will also be a FREE Vitamin B12 blood screening if you participate in any other blood draw at the fair. Vitamin B12 is responsible for keeping blood cells and nerve tissue healthy, preventing a kind of anemia called megaloblastic anemia, and forming DNA. Insufficient B12 in your diet leads to pernicious anemia, neuropathy, depression, fatigue, constipation, and lack of appetite, among other things.

# FUN FACTS ABOUT APRIL



The fourth month of the year brings us April Fools' Day, Earth Day, and the chance for some rain.

According to the early Roman calendar, April was the SECOND month, but became the fourth when they started to use January as the first month. The name originally came from **Aprilis**, meaning "to open." In April, small animals that were hibernating usually come out and the birds fly back northward to settle, bees and butterflies begin to gather nectar.

The birthstone for April is the diamond.

The zodiac signs for April are ARIES (March 21 - April 19) and TAURUS (April 20 - May 20)

The birth flower of April is usually the Sweet Pea or the Daisy.

According to a recent analysis, April showers more often than not DO NOT bring May flowers.

In Scotland, April Fools' lasts two days. Victims of pranks are called "gowks" (cuckoo birds). The second day is known as Taily Day, and pranks involving the backside are played. Supposedly, it is the origin of "kick me" signs.

April Fools' Day may stem from the calendar change in 16th century France when the Gregorian calendar was adopted and New Year's Day moved from April 1 to January 1. People who continued to celebrate New Year's on April 1 rather than January 1 were referred to as "April Fools" and others played tricks on them.




