This time of year is usually kind of difficult for me—you see, 15 years ago I lost my college sweetheart, my soul mate, and the love of my life - between our 36th anniversary in late November and Christmas. Anyone who has lost a close family member will tell you that it never really leaves you. I like to tell folks who have a similar situation that it will get easi-ER, but it will never get “easy.” What makes it tolerable is the fellowship of my Brothers, and of course, my family. MARK YOUR CALENDARS: Saturday, 06 April 2019 7 a.m.-Noon

Are you like me - and wonder just what kind of “impact” our fair has on our participants? Last year, we had 192 participants, and remember we lost power for about 45 minutes. That’s significant in that we probably sent away about 45 to another fair when we didn’t know how long the outage would last.

We provided 24 Colon Cancer kits - Colon cancer is the 2nd leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the U.S. - but it’s largely treatable when caught early.

74 had tests for diabetes, and 22 were out of range—indicating a prediabetes condition. Prediabetes is preventable. 1 in 3 Coloradans has it and 90% of them are UNAWARE of it.

188 tests were made - 72% had LDL values out of the normal range. (LDL is the “bad” cholesterol component) 24% had Triglycerides out of the normal range. (Triglycerides are the “sticky” stuff in the fat family.)

SO, don’t forget, the 9HealthFair provides these low-cost (by comparison to what you would pay at a doctor’s office or the hospital) tests each year and WE provide the opportunity for our community to get these checks on their health.

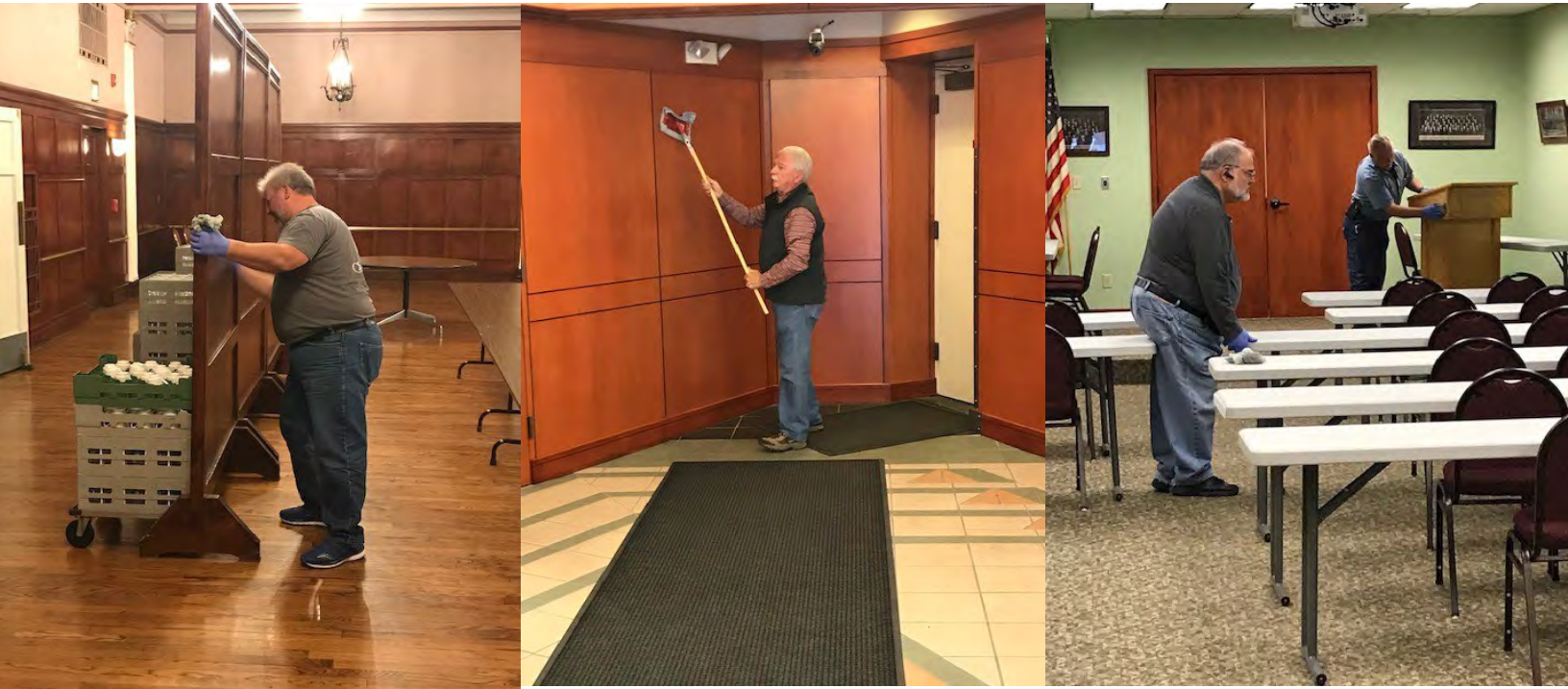

DECEMBER 17th will be our Stated Meeting. We will conduct the election of officers for 2019 and announce the appointments.

STATED MEETING DINNER FEE INCREASE - Effective with the January 21, 2019 Stated Meeting, the fee for dinner will be \$20. The last dinner fee increase was in 2004. Food and labor costs have increased substantially over the past 14 years, necessitating an increase in the price we charge for dinners.

RECEIVE A DISCOUNT ON YOUR STATED MEETING DINNERS - Pre-pay for an entire years' worth of stated meeting dinners and receive one dinner free. Pre-pay for nine dinners and receive the tenth dinner free. To receive the discount you must prepay for all nine dinners at one time. It does not matter when during the year you decide to prepay. The time frame will run consecutively and not on a calendar year basis. **No refunds or credit will be given for pre-paid dinners not utilized during the twelve month period.**

2019 Dues Notices have been mailed by the Supreme Council. For only \$.30 per day, \$9.17 per month, \$110 per year - you can maintain your membership in Denver Consistory. One cup of coffee is more than \$.30. Isn't your Scottish Rite membership worth more to you than the price of a cup of coffee? An **automatic monthly payment plan is available.** Contact the office for details.

Life Membership is an IDEAL way to avoid paying future dues increases. A Life Membership guarantees that you will never be suspended for nonpayment of dues should your future financial situation change. It also ensures that should you no longer be able to take care of your finances, you will not be suspended for nonpayment of dues because your Scottish Rite Membership is of no significance to the individual handling your finances. By purchasing a Life Membership, you leave a continuing legacy to Denver Consistory.

Life Membership Fee:

75 years old and older – a single payment of \$1,000

62-74 years old – a single payment of \$1,500

Younger than 62 – a single payment of \$2,500

ALL: Nice one, Guvnor!

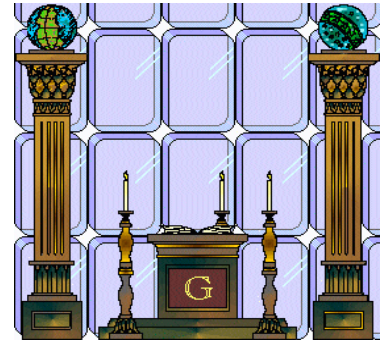
CLOSING THE LODGE

THE PRELATE'S PULPIT

This is a wonderful time of the year. It's a season of giving, of receiving, and of hope. It's time for Christians to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ and for our Jewish Brethren to celebrate Hanukkah (The Feast of Lights).

A bright light guided the shepherds to the Christ child and a bright star guided the Wise Men to present him with their gifts. It is a time for the Jewish people to celebrate Hanukkah, a great military victory against the Greeks who tried to force them to accept Greek traditions. To celebrate the victory at the reclaimed Holy Temple at Jerusalem, they had only enough oil to keep the eternal flame burning in the Temple for a day, but it burned for eight days.
