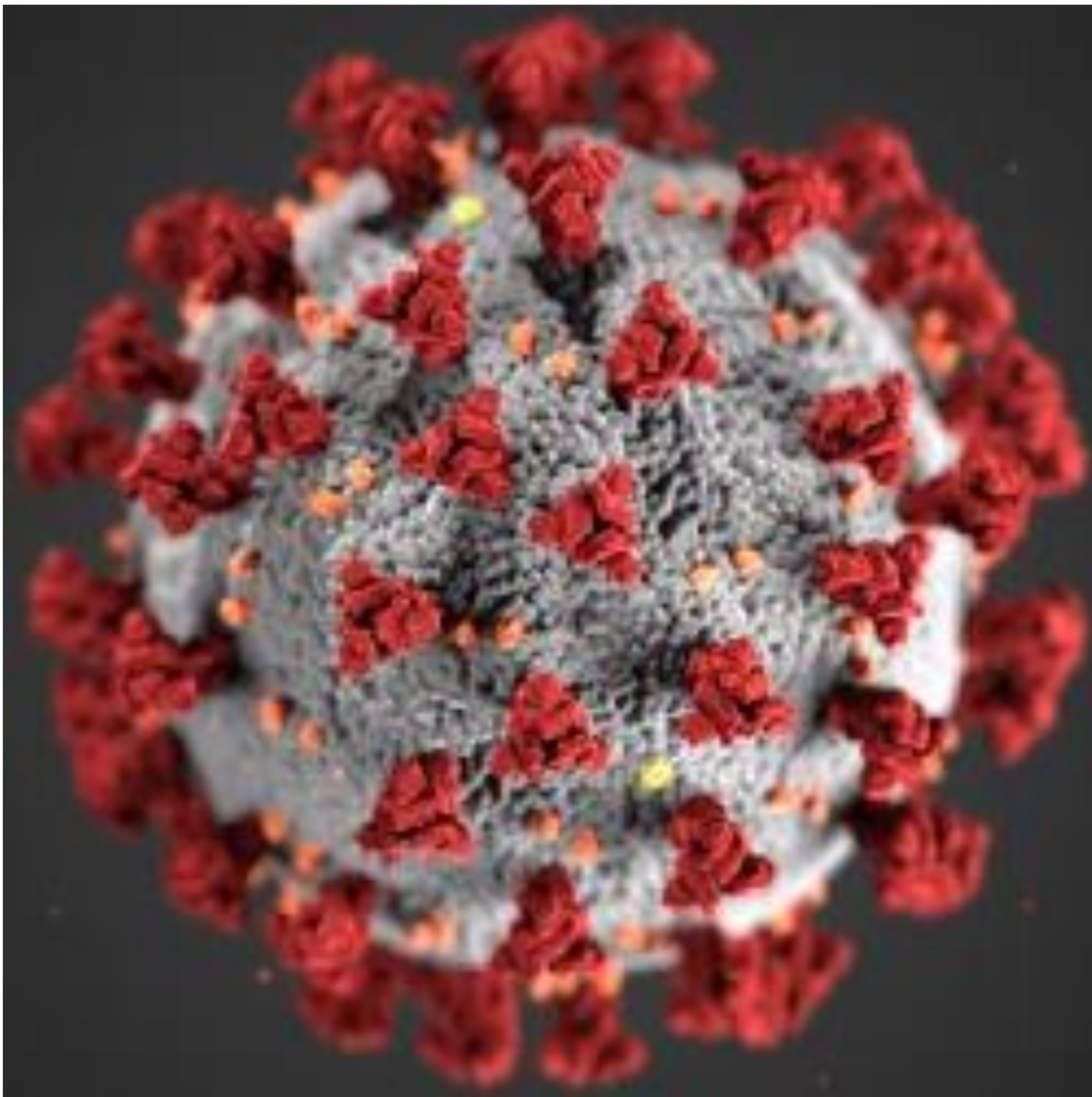

Front Door Security System

A security system has been installed on the sliding door entrance to the building. See that nasty looking sucker on the front page? It's a microscopic representation of that Coronavirus (COVID-19) that is currently rampaging all over the world, and causing panic and serious problems for medical facilities. While we can not afford to take its danger lightly, we can also be INFORMED—not by wild fantasies and conspiracy notions on social media - but rather by doing our diligent homework and not just accepting things at face value, even if they are from our friends and Brothers (well-meaning though they may well be). And, even our mainstream media outlets aren't doing us many favors by giving us pieces of information, snippets from a longer statement which omits critical amplifying information.

There are MANY valid places to find information about the current state of the pandemic we are seeing. Without wanting to sow any further concern, here's a couple of video clips of an interview with a University of Minnesota professor who is an "infectious disease detective" with a lot of experience in similar cases. One of them is only a 15 minute portion which takes you through the essentials. The other one is about an hour long, and it INCLUDES the 15 minute part but goes even further in getting information out to you so you know what to expect.

In these times, we are seeing federal, state, and local declarations of emergency, with all sorts of restrictions on open movements and crowd sizes. Please, take them seriously and consider not just YOUR health and well-being, but that of others around you as well.

Stay safe my Brethren, and when we are able to gather again, we will be all that much more glad to see each other in our familiar settings.

He is Regents Professor, McKnight Presidential Endowed Chair in Public Health, the director of the Center for Infectious Disease Research and Policy (CIDRAP), Distinguished Teaching Professor in the Division of Environmental Health Sciences, School of Public Health, a professor in the Technological Leadership Institute, College of Science and Engineering, and an adjunct professor in the Medical School, all at the University of Minnesota.

FBI SEES RISE IN FRAUD SCHEMES RELATED TO THE CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) PANDEMIC

Scammers are leveraging the COVID-19 pandemic to steal your money, your personal information, or both. Don't let them. Protect yourself and do your research before clicking on links purporting to provide information on the virus; donating to a charity online or through social media; contributing to a crowdfunding campaign; purchasing products online; or giving up your personal information in order to receive money or other benefits. The FBI advises you to be on the lookout for the following:

FAKE CDC Emails. Watch out for emails claiming to be from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) or other organizations claiming to offer information on the virus. Do not click links or open attachments you do not recognize. Fraudsters can use links in emails to deliver malware to your computer to steal personal information or to lock your computer and demand payment. Be wary of websites and apps claiming to track COVID-19 cases worldwide. Criminals are using malicious websites to infect and lock devices until payment is received.

Phishing Emails. Look out for phishing emails asking you to verify your personal information in order to receive an economic stimulus check from the government. While talk of economic stimulus checks has been in the news cycle, government agencies are NOT sending unsolicited emails seeking your private information in order to send you money. Phishing emails may also claim to be related to: Charitable contributions, General financial relief, Airline carrier refunds, Fake cures and vaccines, and Fake testing kits.

Counterfeit Treatments or Equipment. Be cautious of anyone selling products that claim to prevent, treat, diagnose, or cure COVID-19. Be alert to counterfeit products such as sanitizing products and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), including N95 respirator masks, goggles, full face shields, protective gowns, and gloves. More information on unapproved or counterfeit PPE can be found at www.cdc.gov/niosh. You can also find information on the U. S. Food and Drug Administration website, www.fda.gov, and the Environmental Protection Agency website, www.epa.gov. Report counterfeit products at www.ic3.gov and to the National Intellectual Property Rights Coordination Center at iprcenter.gov.

If you are looking for accurate and up-to-date information on COVID-19, the CDC has posted extensive guidance and information that is updated frequently. The best sources for authoritative information on COVID-19 are www.cdc.gov and www.coronavirus.gov. You may also consult your primary care physician for guidance.

The FBI is reminding you to always use good cyber hygiene and security measures. By remembering the following tips, you can protect yourself and help stop criminal activity:

- Don't open attachments or click links within emails from senders you do not recognize.
- Don't provide your username, password, date of birth, social security number, financial data, or other personal information in response to an email or robocall.
- Always verify the web address of legitimate websites and manually type them into your browser.
- Check for misspellings or wrong domains within a link (for example, an address that should end in a ".gov" ends in ".com" instead).

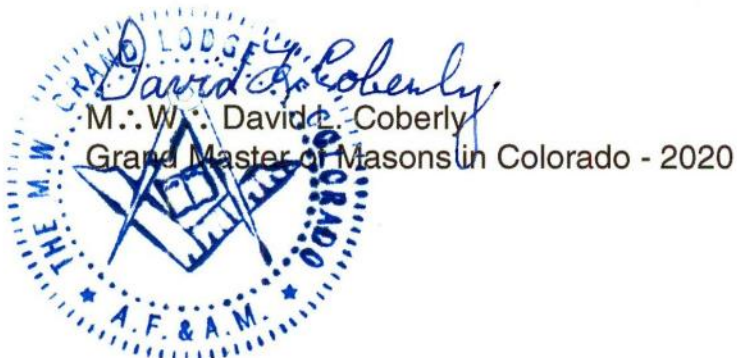

EDICT Number One of the Grand Master

CIVILITY

As a child, I grew up in the 1950's in a small rural community in the Midwest. There was a garage/gas station that had a space that would accommodate a couple of card tables where the old guys (that would include me today), would play "pitch" every morning. This station was next to my parent's business, which made it a hang-out for me as I grew up.

I remember there was always some conversation that centered around the current political events of the day. I found these conversations somewhat interesting because there were so many varying points of view. As I look back today, I have an admiration for those guys - although they strongly disagreed on almost every subject, they never seemed to get angry or degrade the other's character for their positions and beliefs. Even though these gentlemen were simple farmers from the Midwest, they could even occasionally agree on a compromise solution to some of those issues.

Much different than today, the political opinions that you see expressed on Facebook or Twitter, and you will find that nearly all are in "Demonization Mode." The posts that are widely shared are not oriented to changing the mind of someone who disagrees. Instead, posts are written to appeal to people who agree, with the effect of hardening their opinions and closing their minds and degrading the character of those that might disagree.

Are you one of those people who takes to Twitter or Facebook to read about or comment on politics? Are you one of those people that forwards those emails and comments to everyone on your contact list? Are you convinced that the "other side" is so evil that you simply can NOT associate with them in any way? If you think that the problem with political discourse is caused entirely by the other side, then look in the mirror instead.

Consider the following excerpt from an article written by W.B. John Lawson, Grand Chaplain from the Grand Lodge of Washington:

"... As never before, Masonry's example of civil discipline is needed and its great message of working together civilly is the answer that society needs now above all other examples. Having said all of this, it is an important reminder that we have been set apart for this great work of creating a perfect society, a temple built without hands and that through our example, we will lead the world to its golden potential.

We must examine ourselves in this day of Twitter, Facebook, email, and text, and be conscious of the fact that not only the words we share mouth to ear need to be filtered through our grand obligation, but that every hashtag, Facebook post, email forward, or text associated

with us requires our attention and scrutiny. When we wear the Square and Compass as part of our identity, we take on a larger persona than just that of our own personal opinion. We represent a philosophic empire that spreads across the globe.

Each of us are obliged to one another and to the craft that we represent to communicate with respect, the highest degree of integrity, and the deepest concern for the feelings and welfare of others.

Certainly, each Brother is welcome to his own personal opinions and sharing those publicly and clearly is the right of every free man, but the MANNER IN WHICH the opinion is expressed is where civility needs to be checked. We must ask: are we being reasonable, kind, intelligent, and beneficial? Are we allowing comedy, sensationalism, or cleverness to supplant our concerns not to be divisive, cruel, or mean-spirited? Are we more concerned about respect for our personal views than we are about the views of others?

Masonry is an ancient and beautiful craft whose higher standards have the opportunity through each of our mindful efforts to be the guiding example in our social media world that is in great need of our philosophic teachings and inclusiveness, especially today when even our leaders have not been the examples of civility we would like. It makes it ever more important to be the higher example to others that Masonry calls us to be and is something we can do every day to create the world we all know we all want and need; and as Masons, have been charged to create. Let's all pause and examine how we express our opinions in the maelstrom of social media and ensure our rhetoric is something we are all proud of for our craft and others to imitate. May the Great Architect give us wisdom and strength to be the light and example for others to follow.

Basic Understanding of Freemasonry

Freemasonry is the oldest and largest fraternity known. In 17th and 18th century England, Masons defined their fraternity as “a system of morality, veiled in allegory and illustrated by symbols.” Today it might be defined as “an organized society of men who symbolically apply the principles of operative masonry to the art of character building.” As is customary with any concept of thought, it has enjoyed times of great renown and prestige, and it has experienced times of adversity. Freemasonry, today, remains an energetic organization that is attracting advocates over the entire civilized world. Over the years a great deal has been written and said concerning the Masonic Fraternity, much of it fact, and much of it fiction. It is perhaps inevitable that myths have arisen with respect to Freemasonry, some of them advanced by its supporters and others of them promoted by its critics, and that the dissemination of these myths has produced confused conceptions of Freemasonry. Freemasonry teaches, through ritual, how to build a better world by making “better men out of good men,” by strengthening their character, improving their moral and spiritual outlook and broadening their mental horizons. It teaches men: principles of personal responsibility and righteousness; and understanding of character; and how to put these lessons into practice in daily life. The man who has decided to seek Masonic membership needs only to convey his desire to someone close to him who is a Mason. That Mason will take it from there.

Freemasonry teaches the universal principle of unselfish friendship and promotes those moral precepts, which are in keeping with all great faiths. The following, though not exclusive, is considered basic: One God created mankind; this God is the author of all life; God's existence is revealed to man through faith and the Book of Holy Scriptures; the Book of Holy Scriptures is the Ultimate Authority or Great Light in Freemasonry; the Soul of man is immortal; Man's commitment to Divine Providence determines his destiny; Man's reverence for God is best exemplified by his actions toward his fellow man; Considering the universality of Freemasonry, its teachings cannot be defined in any single statement or established profile. The following is considered to be representative of its fundamental precepts: Man's first duty is to love and revere God, implore his aid in all laudable undertakings, and seek his guidance through prayer, embrace and practice the tenets of religion, extend charity and sympathy to all mankind, shield and support the widow and orphan, defend virtue, respect the aged, honor the bonds of friendship, protect the hopeless, lift up the oppressed, comfort the downcast, restore dignity to the rejected, respect the laws of government, promote morality, and add to the common stock of knowledge and understanding. The heart of Freemasonry is the heart of its members.

The making of a Freemason is a continued course of education, training, and character forming or symbolically known as the “search for more light.” It is also an innermost desire,

followed by obligations, that makes one a member of the Craft, yet in a truer sense, a man is not a Freemason unless he lives up to his obligations. The philosophy of Freemasonry, when discovered and then accepted and practiced, provides simple but profound solutions to the problems of human relationships. The man who has been raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason must understand that there is nothing higher and nothing superior to him in Masonry. When he has become a Master Mason, he has become as much a Mason as he will ever be. Thus, the man who has received the three degrees in the Symbolic Lodge, or Blue Lodge, is a Master Mason. The Master Mason Degree is the climax of Freemasonry. Thus, it is the "sublime degree," and is supreme and unexcelled. From the Symbolic Lodge, or Blue Lodge, one may join other Masonic groups such as the York Rite and the Scottish Rite. These are sometimes called "higher degrees." They are higher ONLY in the sense that they have higher numbers and that some of them are prerequisite for others. However, there is nothing higher and nothing superior to the degree of Master Mason. There are certain other organizations, the best known of which are perhaps the Shrine and the Grotto, which are not Masonic bodies, but organizations which require Masonic membership as a prerequisite for joining them. These organizations, in other words, draw their membership exclusively from the Masonic Fraternity, but they are not a part of it.

Freemasonry is not a religion even though it is religious in character. It does not pretend to take the place of religion or serve as a substitute for the religious beliefs of its Members. Freemasonry accepts men, found to be worthy, regardless of religious convictions. An essential requirement is a belief in the existence of a Supreme Being. Freemasonry is not an insurance or beneficial society. It is not organized for profit. However, the charity and services rendered are beyond measure. It teaches the Golden Rule. It seeks to make good men better through its firm belief in the Fatherhood of God, the Brotherhood of Man, and the Immortality of the Soul. The tenets of Freemasonry are ethical principles that are acceptable to all good men. It teaches tolerance toward all mankind. It is known throughout the world, it consists of men bound together by bonds of Brotherly Love and Affection. It dictates to no man as to his beliefs, either religious or secular. It seeks no advantage for its Members through business or politics. Freemasonry is not a forum for discussions on partisan affairs. We assemble for work and fellowship and to learn to love and cherish one another. By so doing, we bring light out of darkness, beauty out of drabness, exaltation out of despair, to the end that every Brother's life may become more radiant and meaningful.

To summarize, no man can live according to the principles and teachings of Ancient Craft Masonry and do anything, knowingly and willingly, that is contrary to moral and upright principles. Freemasonry frowns on every wrongful act and admonishes the right actions between each of us and the world at large. Freemasonry is, and should always be, a guide to our actions. Freemasonry is kindness in the home, honesty in business, courtesy in society, fairness in work, pity and concern for the unfortunate, resistance toward evil, help for the weak, forgiveness for the penitent, love for one another and, above all, reverence and love for God. Freemasonry is many things, but most of all: **FREEMASONRY IS A WAY OF LIFE.**

Lee and I recently spent a couple of hours having breakfast at Marion's of the Rockies in Idaho Springs. What a great morning! We laughed, we hugged, we cried, we shared secrets and drank probably a gallon of coffee. Let me share part of that morning with you.)

This month's member spotlight will focus on one of the hardest-working Masons in Colorado! Brother Lee Miller is a familiar face at the Consistory. He is the Master of Ceremonies in the Colorado Council of Kadosh, Secretary of the Knights of St. Andrew of the Denver Consistory, and a key cast member in several degrees. You might remember him as Moses, thundering down the mountain with the tablets in the 14th degree.

His wife Karen is a charge nurse at Denver Health. She previously worked for Lee in his ICU and "chased him for two years until he caught her!" Lee has a daughter from his first marriage, Rebecca, who is a neo-natal ICU nurse in Chattanooga, Tennessee. She gave birth to Lee's first grandchild, a beautiful little girl, in December 2019.

Lee has three other children. Son Chris is 27 and is working at the Veterinary Medicine Lab at Colorado State University in Fort Collins. Son Nick, 26, is a member of the Denver Consistory and was in a Reunion Class about two years ago. Nick works for Raytheon in Aurora, is in the Army Reserves and is awaiting orders to Officer Candidate School. Son Andy, 23, is a special-needs adult and is living and working in Denver.

Lee's father was a District Field Manager for a life insurance company. This meant that the family moved every couple of years as his dad would set up a new office for the company, get it up and running, and then move to the next location. This was primarily in the south - Georgia, Tennessee, and Florida. At one point, the family moved to Indianapolis, but it was just "too big" and they returned to the south.

Lee initially received a BS degree in Physics and a BS degree in Nursing (nursing and physics?) from the University of Tennessee, and later on graduate degrees from Georgia and Colorado. He claims not to know Peyton Manning personally. He was working as a paramedic firefighter in college and after graduation, while working as an Emergency Department nurse, was going to join the Air Force Reserve to be a flight nurse. However, he ended up in Uncle Sam's Army and spent eight years at various posts with multiple deployments. After Desert Storm,

Lee was assigned to Fitzsimons Army Medical Center. Upon arriving in Denver, the first question he asked of the cab driver (it was a cloudy day) was, “where are the mountains?” Upon separating from active duty, Lee worked for several hospitals in the ED and the ICU.

When I asked him why he became a nurse, especially an ICU nurse, his response was simple. He said, “Helping people in need, in their worst times, is what I was put here to do.” This might have been one of the instances when my eyes started sweating.

The men in Lee’s family have been Masons for many generations. Lee didn’t actually become a Mason until about 12 years ago, when his grandfather passed. His grandmother gave Lee a box filled with his grandfather’s Masonic “stuff.” A couple of Masonic rings, a few lapel pins, and items like that. Lee had never asked his father or grandfather about becoming a Mason; thus, he had not been asked to fill out a petition. When he received the box of mementos, he knew that there was a message there. He called the Grand Lodge of Colorado and they put him in touch with Sam Wittner, the Secretary of Albert Pike #117 at the time. Brother Sam invited Lee to meet a couple of men who were also interested in becoming Masons. One of those men was Christopher Scott who became the first man to be initiated into Albert Pike #117 in over 7 years. Lee was Worshipful Master of Albert Pike #117 in 2017 and is now the Secretary. Albert Pike recently merged with Pythagoras #41 and is now Marquis de Lafayette #41.

Among the men most important to Brother Lee’s Masonic journey, he mentioned Sam Wittner, Jim Oliver, Christopher Scott, Ron Birely, Jay Allen, Roy Snyder, Karl Hinkle, Joe Kier, and Roger Stene. What a great and impressive list of friends!

Lee is active in the York Rite. He is a Past Excellent High Priest of Golden Chapter #5, Past Thrice Illustrious Master of Jefferson Council #24, and Past Eminent Commander of Jefferson-Highlands Commandery #30 and now serves those bodies as Secretary/Recorder. He is the Secretary of the Front Range Allied Masonic Degrees Council #288 and the Sentinel of the Centennial York Rite College #87. He served as the Eminent Encampment Commander for the Grand Commandery in 2017-2019 and currently serves as District Inspector. He is also currently serving in the Officer Lines of the York Rite Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Colorado and the York Rite Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Colorado.

Lee is also a Noble of El Jebel Shrine and is a member of the El Jebel Shrine Medical Staff. He is 1st Vice President of the Denver-Fitzsimons Chapter #37, National Sojourners; a member of the Heroes of ‘76, Two Scout Camp; a member of the Royal Order of Scotland; Past Honorable Grand Commander-in-Chief of Centennial Order #126 of the Sword of Bunker Hill; a Fellow of the Grand College of Rites; a Knight of St. Thomas of Acon, Rocky Mountain Chapel #26; a member of the Masonic Society and a member of the Widow’s Sons, Grand Chapter of Colorado.

I said earlier that he is the busiest Mason in town!

Lee left our breakfast meeting to go “punch some holes in paper.” He is an accomplished marksman and avid shooter. He’s a Benefactor Life Member and Golden Eagle member of the NRA and several other shooting organizations. He also is involved with the American Legion and with the American Legion Riders, a motorcycle group of Legion members.

As we were leaving the restaurant, I asked Lee to give me some parting thoughts:

- Lee sees himself as an Entered Apprentice - Always learning, every day.
