The primary purpose of this letter is to provide you with information regarding my desires for a Masonic funeral service on my passing. I am providing this information to my closest friends and family with the hope that on my death my wishes to have a Masonic service may be known, and carried out in the most effortless manner possible.

If you are not familiar with the Masons, allow me to tell you a few of the reasons that I belong to this honorable fraternity. Freemasonry is a worldwide fraternity that requires belief in a Supreme Being and is guided by three principal tenets: Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. Masons are encouraged to exemplify these tenets in the performance of our duties to God, our neighbor, and ourselves. Indeed, one of the motto's of freemasonry is "Making good men better". This is accomplished through a variety of methods, including a number of charitable services to our fellowman.

The Masonic funeral services are performed free of charge for any Mason, as a service for the departed member and his family. In addition, there are several different Masonic groups that Masons may join, each with their own memorial service.
